AIO ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Every fall, AIO launches our **Energy Assistance Program**. This year, our help is needed more than ever. Families struggle with rising costs from rent, fuel, electricity, food, childcare, and health care. Here along the Maine Coast, food insecurity and energy insecurity go hand-in-hand.

This article from Children's Watch captures the essence of the critical intersection between food and energy insecurity:

In "heat or eat" situations, families strive in vain for a safe balance between paying for food and paying for energy. When most of us think about poverty and hunger, our minds direct us to the bare kitchen table or the empty refrigerator. Few of us would also imagine the thermostat turned to "off" or an electricity shut-off notice arriving in the mail. The reality is that America's low-income families must constantly struggle to protect their children from multiple threats to their health and growth, of which energy insecurity can at times be the most immediately life-threatening.

Energy insecurity occurs when there is limited or uncertain access to enough home energy to sustain a healthy and safe life in the geographic area where a household is located. Moderately energy insecure families have received a letter threatening utility shut-off in the last year. Severely energy insecure families have experienced an actual utility shut-off, at least one day with no energy for heating or cooling, or have used a cooking stove as a heating source in the last year.

Providing energy assistance is expensive. There is no national energy bank to support our program. We help families in our community entirely from donations made to AIO by local individuals and businesses.

It's never too late to get your year end reports in. It takes time to prepare the annual meeting reports. It's greatly appreciated if you could email them to the office before JANUARY 17th.


Annual Meeting is Sunday January 23rd after services.
