# Welcome



On Sunday, February 15th, we will be welcoming Pastoral Candidate Rev. Heidi Grueser. After months of discussions and meetings, the Pastoral Search Committee will present Rev. Heidi to the congregation during a service, followed by a Q&A session. Following this discussion, church members will be asked to cast their votes.

The committee believes that this candidate possesses many of the qualifications, experience, and qualities we are seeking in our minister. We have shared our findings with the Trustees, and both committees are united in presenting this candidate to the congregation for consideration.

We received numerous applications, reviewed several strong candidates, and conducted Zoom interviews with at least three applicants. We have engaged in extensive conversations with Rev. Heidi, checked her references—both personal and professional—and completed credit and criminal background checks.

### Brief Biography

Pastor Heidi Grueser brings 30 years of ministerial experience and has felt her calling since early childhood. She is ordained through the United Methodist Church and holds a bachelor's degree in Christian Education, along with a Master of Divinity degree from Asbury Theological Seminary. Additionally, she is a self-proclaimed expert in Biblical History, thanks to her numerous trips to the Holy Land.

Her current role is at a non-denominational Christian Church in Prince George, Virginia, and her previous ministry was in Southwest Florida. She has served as a Chaplain at a pediatric hospital and managed the Ronald McDonald House in both Orlando and Jacksonville, Florida, focusing on children.

Rev. Heidi is a single mother of three adopted daughters: an older daughter who is married and two younger sisters, ages 9 and 10. Their family includes two dogs named Hallelujah and Glory—or Glory Hallelujah!

We were particularly impressed by her energy, enthusiasm, and dedication to children and community. She has inspired her churches to establish thrift shops, currently coaches girls' soccer teams at school, and enjoys engaging with the community.

We have invited her, and she has enthusiastically accepted, to conduct a Sunday service on February 15th. We hope and pray that you find her as inspiring and promising as we have.

The deacons and the congregation extended their hands in fellowship, and we wish them all the best.



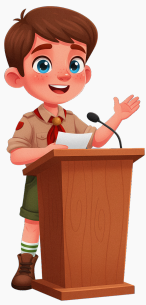
## ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

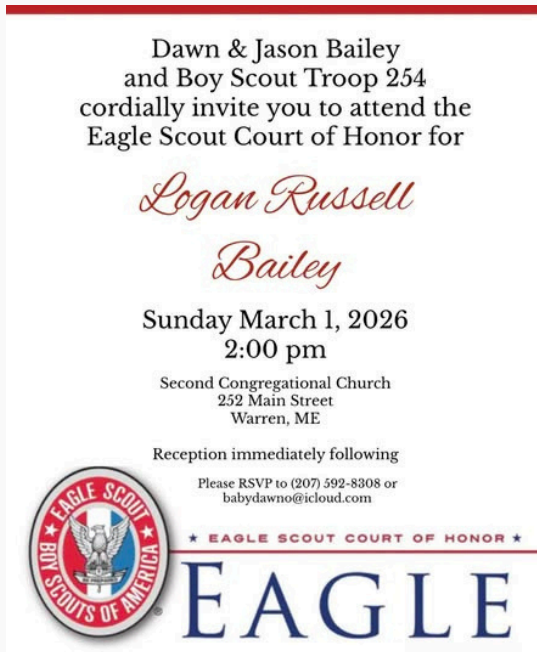


# scout sunday

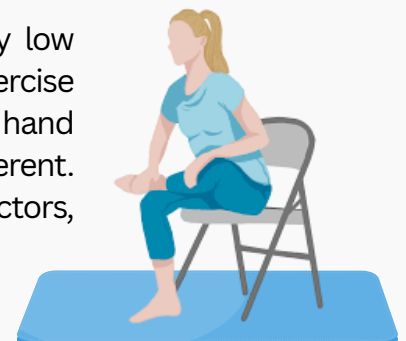


## LET'S PLAY guess who this is... DO YOU KNOW?
